Parent Governor Vacancy

I am writing to inform you of a vacancy for the role of parent governor on our governing board. If you have ever wondered what the school governing board does, then here is an opportunity to find out, and perhaps help to influence how the school shapes its future.

The role of the governing board:

The school's governing board is responsible for providing confident and strategic leadership, and creating robust accountability, oversight, and assurance for the school's educational and financial performance. The board is passionate about education and committed to continuous school improvement to ensure the best possible outcomes for our students.

As a governor you don't need to be an expert in education, finance, or data analysis, but what you do need is an interest in our school, our community, the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved. The governing board requires a diverse array of skills to discharge its responsibilities, some of which you will almost certainly already have.

The role of a parent governor:

As a parent governor, you will work with the board to ensure it effectively carries out the duties referred to above. You will also play a vital role in ensuring that the board relates to, and is aware of the views of, parents and the local community.

To be a parent governor you should have:

- A strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children
- Good inter-personal skills, curiosity, and a willingness to learn and develop new skills
- The specific skills required to ensure the governing board delivers effective governance

Although not essential, the following skills would greatly enhance the effectiveness of our governing board:

- Health & Safety
- Finance
- HR

If you are new to governance, you will be provided with a structured induction and the opportunity to undertake training as required. You will also be provided with an experienced governor as a mentor.

Expectations of governors:

- Term of office is 1-4 years (you do not have to resign if your child leaves the school)
- Time commitment is 6 8 hours per month
- Attend at least 3 meetings of the full governing board per year











- Governors are encouraged to sit on committees, focused on an area they have knowledge
 of, or are particularly interested in. We have two committees, both of which also meet 3
 times per year
- Visit the school formally for monitoring purposes at least 4 times a year
- Visit the school informally at least once a year
- Undertake training as required to enable you to discharge your role effectively
- Attend school events
- Maintain confidentiality

All parents or carers of registered pupils at the school at the time of a parent governor election are eligible to become parent governors, unless they are:

- An elected member of the local authority or
- Paid to work in the school for more than 500 hours in any consecutive 12-month period (at the time of election or appointment)

How to apply:

If you are interested in applying for the role, please complete the candidate form attached. If we receive more applications than there are vacancies, a ballot will be carried out. We will inform you closer to the time if we have to do this.
