

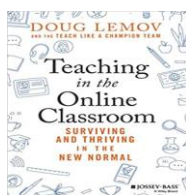
# Remote Teaching and Learning Bulletin



## GOOGLE CLASSROOM UPDATES

- Mrs Beechener and Mrs Parkins have delivered 2 CPD sessions refining our use and skills with Google Classroom- this is largely down to staff sharing things as they navigate their way through remote learning. Thanks to Mrs Hinds-Taylor for sharing her expertise with staff!
- This time last year we didn't even know our way around Google Classroom and now, less than a year later, we have staff trialing things such as **Jamboard** and **Google Forms** to improve their T&L with the live lessons. We've come a long way!
- The pedagogy we have looked at in our T&L CPD sessions since September are still hugely important and in our last CPD session we demonstrated how both TEEP and Rosenshine's Theory can be easily applied to remote learning. Mrs Gruppioni has successfully used the **3,2,1 answers up** via the chat function in live lessons and the English department have continued with their **recall/retrieval** tasks at the beginning of sessions.
- Questioning** continues to be a focus, allowing us to create that connection with students despite not being face to face. Staff are becoming more comfortable with direct questioning through the chat function/Jamboard.

All students have access to help guides on how to submit work via our school website and we have sent this information out all students via Google Classroom:

#### USING A SMARTPHONE TO PHOTOGRAPH AND UPLOAD WORK TO GOOGLE CLASSROOM—VIA THE APP

This guide has been created with an iPhone but the steps should be the same if you are using the GOOGLE CLASSROOM APP on any smartphone or tablet. To upload a photograph of your work you need to go to the assignment that has been set and underneath you will see the YOUR WORK area.

**Step 1:** Click the ADD ATTACHMENT button. This will bring up a new menu with a few options.

**Step 2:** To attach a photo select the PICK PHOTO option if you have already taken a photograph. If you need to take a photograph select the USE CAMERA option.

**Step 3:** If you have selected PICK PHOTO you need to select the album your photo is already stored in.

**Step 4:** Select the photograph that best shows off your work. TOP TIP: Make sure the photograph is taken in good light and the camera is focused!

**Step 5:** When you have selected the photo, you will see this screen. Wait until it has fully loaded to ensure it is properly attached.

**Step 6:** You will then see your photo file listed. TOP TIP: Don't forget to hit the SEND IN button to make sure your work is fully submitted.

### Student Feedback

Year 11 students have remarked on how much they continue to learn even though it's remote learning. They've gone as far as to say they are enjoying it.

Staff continue to look at how they present the information via live lessons to make this as accessible as possible to students- this has come from student feedback.
